

WHAT IS EXPECTED TO COMPLETE THIS PROGRAM?

This program is comprised of several course sessions and incorporates the use of the participant's own photographic work. The following bullet points list the elements that each participant is required to complete in this program:

- To effectively communicate his/ hers thoughts verbally and graphically as a landscape lighting designer
- To understand and utilize the proper lighting terminology necessary to communicate to clients and the design community
- To complete each year of the program, whether or not the student intends on completing the entire four-year program—once signed-up, you must complete that years training if the student expects to receive a “certificate of completion”
- To complete the assigned projects given over the following year while away from the conference
- To submit photo-work of a project for peer review, concept understanding, gallery presentation, and entrance into the Awards Program
- To purchase and read the intended study materials for the program

PROGRAM LAYOUT

The complete program consists of four (4) total years and then they will receive the Landscape Lighting Design Master (LLDM) designation.

During the first year of training, the participant will primarily listen with limited participation. As the participant enters the repetitive nature of the program during the second and consecutive years, they will become more participatory. The participant will join in the presenting of projects through the design gallery format and entertain direct conversations during the sessions and during peer review meetings.

To complete this program, the participant will be required to complete the following tasks. First, the participant will commit to reaching the LLDM level over a continuous four year period. Second, the participant will be required to purchase and read selected educational materials. Third, the student will be required to review & perform the assignments of the take-home design project(s). And fourth, engage in efforts that will advance the educational level of the participant's knowledge, such as, attending seminars, classes, or trade shows related to this discipline.

Although this is the first year of the programs release to its membership, we intend to refine and add content to better the program. This will take place over the next couple of years through conference input and membership suggestions.
